Fortunately there was no damage to the school. The senior students have already experienced camp, attending an outdoor education facility at Anglesea in February. There they experienced a variety of coastal based activities as well as forming valuable friendships with students from other small local schools. Each week staff members nominate students for various awards to acknowledge academic success and good behaviour in the school grounds. Photos of the weekly winners now feature prominently on a special display board in the school foyer. A whole school excursion to the Werribee Open Plains Zoo was a special treat for students in the last week of term one. Funded by a grant the students travelled to the zoo by bus, participated in an education session and then a safari ride where they were able to see a variety of animals. Also in the last week of term our school was involved in the East Goulburn Primary School Sports Association athletics sports at McEwen Reserve in Shepparton. Invergordon students competed against those from Shepparton East, Tallygaroopna, Kialla West, Kialla Central, Dookie, Congupna, Zeerust, Lemnos, Wunghnu, Katamatite and Katandra West Primary Schools. Staff and students would like to acknowledge the assistance of parent, Tania Ward who gave up her time prior to the sports to come into the school and assist with training for the many track and field events.
