**INVERGORDON PRIMARY SCHOOL:** In the most recent newsletter Invergordon Primary staff thanked and congratulated the parent community for their continued support of the school and its students. Some of the voluntary tasks undertaken by families in the past term have included extensive gardening and infrastructure maintenance, fundraising, providing hot lunches through the winter months and assisting in the classroom with academic studies and craft. Small primary schools rely and thrive on such support and Invergordon has long been the envy of other schools for the level it receives. Locals may have seen students out and about several weeks ago on a bike hike, an annual event at the school. After two weeks of an intensive bicycle education program the bike hike takes a different route each year and allows the children to put into practice the learned safe riding techniques whilst having fun at the same time. Illustrator, Richard Herbert was a popular visiting artist to the school during the term. Richard is the creator of the illustrations in some of the students' favourite storybooks and they were pleased to see, first -hand how he invented his wonderful characters. The grades 3-6 boys made use of the kitchen to cook up a mouth -watering meal of spaghetti and meatballs. As well as enjoying eating the finished product the boys also learned that cooking requires reading, comprehension and listening skills and lots of maths. The sports shed will be re-stocked with new sporting equipment, courtesy of Coles, after more than 6000 shopping tokens were collected and will now be redeemed for new equipment.
